Pastor's Report

This summer I went on road trip of a lifetime together with my family. 3,900 km through BC and the Rockies. Not to mention the many hours at sea. All traversed in the little blue car – 'The Smurf' as we named it – that many of you know from the reserved spot in our parking lot. I went to places I have always dreamed of visiting. I went to places I did not know of before moving here, but that were recommended to visit. And I discovered places that I had never heard of but that surprised me with their beauty and atmosphere. BC truly is beautiful.

Arriving home, many of you told me that I had probably seen more of BC than many from the congregation had seen in a lifetime. In a way it makes sense. To many, travelling is about exploring new places. Not about driving around one's own backyard. People go south. Or at least they used to. But since I am only here temporarily, BC is not my backyard, and I figured I had to go within the limited time I will be around.

I once hiked a month around Scotland. There I met many tourists. But on a ferry towards the Outer Hebrides, I also met a Scotsman who had put upon himself to see his backyard. He told me that it had cost him double the amount of money compared to his friend who had taken a plane to the Mediterranean. But he insisted on seeing his native land.

This person inspired me. Before meeting him, I had never really thought of hiking in Denmark. But in the following years I hiked on 'Hærvejen', 'Øhavsstien', and 'Gendarmstien'. I found that many of you from the congregation are inspiring in the same way. You might not have seen parts of BC that I visited this Summer, but you have seen places in Denmark that I have never seen. With your roots being both Canadian and Danish, many of you have told me about trips to Denmark where you did not visit traditional Danish tourist sights. You told me of trips where you visited old farms and family that lived far off the grid (at least as far of as you can get in small Denmark). Your trips were not about sights, They were and are about exploring roots.

Exploring roots is important. It makes you discover so much about yourself. And as Grundtvig argued; only by firstly discovering oneself, can one secondly venture out into the world as a whole person.

Therefore, thanks to all of you for giving me recommendations on where to go. But thank you also for being an inspiration. Travelling is not only about exploring destinations, but also about exploring oneself.

BOOK REVIEW: Churning Butter - Christian Marker and the Rise of the Alberta Dairy Industry Reviewed by Dr. Kurt F. Jensen, Adjunct Professor, Carleton University

Christian Marker was Alberta's first dairy commissioner. A Danish immigrant from a small-farm background but with a solid education in the Danish dairy industry.

Rolf Christensen has put together a book much more exciting and entertaining than a cursory glance at a book about dairy production might suggest. Marker, the son of a hero from the Dano-Prussian War, recognized that the opportunities in Denmark as a small landowner were narrow. He was ambitious — and clever. He immigrated to Canada in 1890 with little money. He initially worked as a dairy man in Ontario, during which time he met Dominion Dairy Commissioner James Robertson, who was so impressed that he offered Marker a job at the Central Experimental Farm in Ottawa.

There were many challenges to making the Canadian dairy industry. Marker studied and researched constantly and followed the Danish dairy industry closely.

Marker arrived in Calgary in 1897 to manage the government-operated creameries. Following creation of the Alberta province in 1905, Marker went from being Superintendent of Government Creameries to becoming the first Dairy Commissioner of Alberta, a position he retained for the remainder of his career, which eventually included being, concurrently, a Professor of Agriculture at the University of Alberta (eventually receiving an honourary Ph.D.). He was appointed the Honourary Danish Vice-Consul in Calgary until his move to Edmonton in 1921.

Marker was aided by many others of near similar enthusiasm and capabilities. Many of them were Danish immigrants, or other Scandinavians, as well as Anglo-Canadians. The large number of Danes involved in the industry simply reflected that Denmark was where the critical industrial advances originated. The book contains many chapters providing brief histories of these other critical players in the dairy industry.

Christensen's book is an important contribution to documenting the history of Danes in Canada as well as capturing a sense of the social history of the West at a critical time. The book paints a colourful picture of those engaged in the dairy industry, the hardships and times of penury, and the founding of communities whose inhabitants worked together for the betterment of all. **This is a book well worth reading**.


